### BOX TOPS FOR EDUCATION DUE DATE

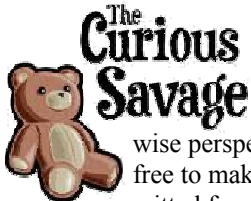
If you've been saving up those box tops, now is the time to send them in! **Our next collection day is Friday, October 21st.** Thanks for saving them, they really add up and help our school.
